ROUND MOUNTAIN WATER AND SANITATION DISTRICT RESOLUTION NUMBER 2021-12

A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A MORITORIUM ON WATER AND WASTEWATER TAP AVAILABILITY EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2022

WHEREAS, since 2016, the Round Mountain Water and Sanitation District (District) has been actively pursuing replacing the existing wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) originally installed in 1975, and

WHEREAS, the existing WWTP is past its useful life span, undersized, critically overloaded and is subject to a Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) compliance mandate, and

WHEREAS, a proposed replacement WWTP design has been completed and approved by CDPHE. However, the installation and operation costs of this new WWTP are far beyond the ability of the District to finance, forcing the District to search for a more affordable and effective wastewater treatment method, and

WHEREAS, the District has no known time frame of when the current WWTP will be replaced, and due to the critical overloading of the existing WWTP,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ROUND MOUNTAIN WATER AND SANITATION DISTRICT, COLORADO THAT:

Effective January 1, 2022, the District will place a moratorium on the sales of water and sewer taps that will remain in effect until the day construction commences of an approved and financed replacement WWTP.
